Afternoon Camp Swim Lessons (Grades K - 5)

Our swim lesson curriculum begins with basic swimming readiness skills and, as results are achieved, progresses to stroke introduction, refinement, and technique. This approach provides students with a solid foundation for refining their swimming skills as they progress through the stages of the program.

Mini Camp (Entering Kindergarten)

Mini Camp provides children a creative and exciting learning experience. Campers will participate in art and crafts, games, sports, songs, swimming and more!

Day Camp (Entering 1 – 3, 4 – 8)

Campers will create great summer memories while participating in sports, games, art and crafts, swimming, songs and daily special events! This is one of our most popular camps.

S.K.O.R. CAMP (ages 5 – 21)

This camp is specially designed for children with intellectual disabilities. S.K.O.R. offers a 5:1 camper to staff ratio and a full range of activities and experiences including a variety of sports, swimming and crafts. Campers must be partially toilet trained, must have some way of communicating their needs, and must be free of uncontrollable aggressive behaviors. SKOR Camp transportation is available at the JKR bus stop only.

S.K.O.R. half day camp (ages 5 – 15)

Available during the weeks ESY runs, campers may be dropped off after their ESY Day. Campers will participate in all S.K.O.R. and Integrated camp activities once at the camp. Transportation must be arranged by the parent/guardian and is not provided by the YMCA.

INTEGRATED CAMP PROGRAM

Inclusion within our Summer Camp program means that individuals with disabilities are welcome to participate in all camps. Some minimum eligibility requirements (age, level of participation) must be met in order to participate. You must check the box on the application for the support staff to be assigned to you.

The Leader in Training program is for campers looking to develop and enhance their leadership skills. They will also have opportunities to practice these learned skills by taking on a leadership role in camp by helping with weekly themes, special events and other activities.




Video Game Week
