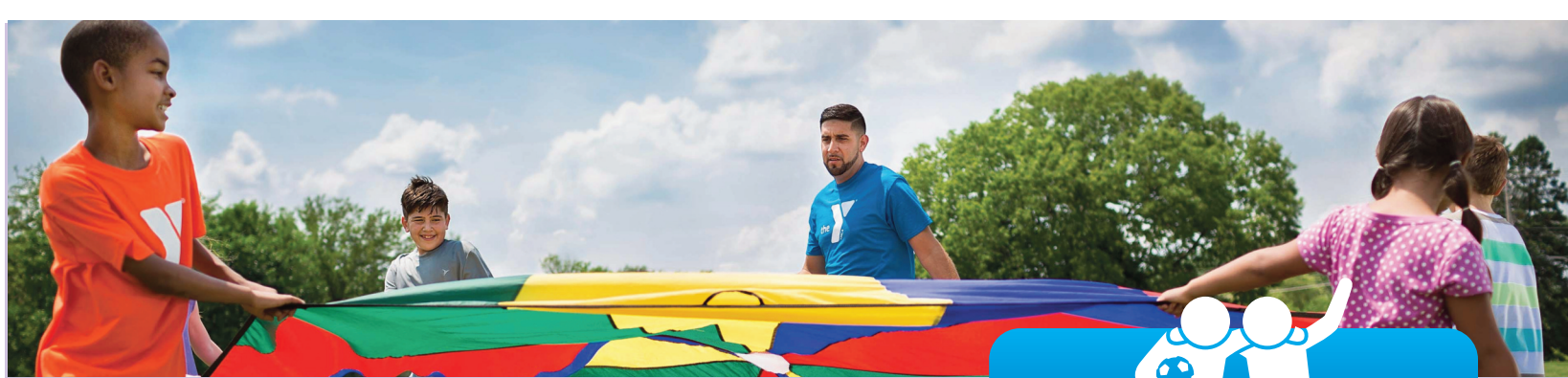

Parents Trust Us

When you drop your child off at camp, we know that you are trusting us to provide high-quality care. With a low, 10:1 camper-to-staff ratio, each child receives the attention they need to grow in a safe, supportive environment. Our on-site, full-time nurse provides additional support.

Everyone belongs at the Y.

We believe in serving the needs of all members of our community including those who may be unable to pay the full cost of membership or programs. Financial assistance is based on a number of factors including total household income and number of dependents in the household. Financial assistance applications are required and are **due by May 1**. The process is confidential. Applications are available at both branches or online at hamiltonymca.org.

Caring & Well Trained Staff

At Summer Camp at the Hamilton Area YMCA, we believe that our staff is our greatest resource. Each of our staff undergoes a series of interviews, reference checks, and a complete background/criminal history check. Our Coordinators are college graduates who are working professionals in the fields of education and child development. Our senior staff is at least 18 years of age with prior experience working with children. All staff participate in 28 hours of camp training and our leadership and senior staff is certified in First Aid and CPR and sun safety.

Inclusive Programming

The Hamilton Area YMCA and its Summer Camp program encourages and supports the participation of individuals with disabilities in all programs and services. Inclusion within our Summer Camp program means that individuals with disabilities are welcome to participate in the same camps as their non-disabled peers. Please contact the Camp Director if your child would like to be a part of our integrated camp program.

Membership

At minimum, a Hamilton Area YMCA program membership is required for each child to attend all camps. Program memberships are valid for one year and entitle your child to enroll in our youth programs and sports leagues.

Registration Information

Registration can be done in person at either branch. Once registered, balances may be paid online. A \$25 non-refundable **deposit** per week, per camper is required at the time of registration. **Changes** can be made as follows: The first camp change may be made at no charge. All subsequent changes are assessed a \$25 fee each time. Changes after June 1 must be approved by the Camp Director. **Refunds** (less the \$25 deposit) will be granted through May 15. Refunds will not be given after May 15.

Mini Camp (entering kindergarten)

Mini Camp provides children a creative and stimulating learning experience. Campers will participate in special events, crafts, games, sports, songs, swimming and more!

Voyagers (entering grades 1 – 2)

Voyager Day Campers will create memories and grow friendships while participating in sports, games, crafts, swimming, songs and specials! Many other fun activities will be offered in this popular camp.

Navigators I and II (entering grades 3 – 4 and 5 – 6)

This fun camp offers a wide range of activities for your child. Traditional day camp activities including sports, games, crafts and daily swimming are part of this camp. Navigators will go on an exciting and educational field trip weeks 5 (Camden Aquarium), 6 (Franklin Institute), 7 (Philadelphia Zoo), and 8 (Liberty Science Center). (Additional fee applies for trip weeks. See registration form.)

Teen Camp (entering grades 7 – 8)

Teen camp activities are designed to keep the interest and creative energy for this age group. Traditional day camp activities including sports, games, crafts and daily swimming are part of this camp. Teen Campers will go on exciting and educational field trips on the following weeks: 5 (Camden Aquarium), 6 (Franklin Institute), 7 (Liberty Science Center), and 8 (Philadelphia Zoo). (Additional fee applies for trip weeks. See registration form.)

SPECIALTY CAMP

Wet n' Wild (entering grades 1 – 3)*

This wet, wild and fun camp will keep campers cool! Have fun with a variety of fun filled water games and water activities which may include drip, drip, drop, water balloon toss, sprinklers and slip n' slide fun!

Neverland Adventure (entering grades 1 – 5)*

Calling all Lost Boys and Tinkerbells! Take another imaginary journey to Neverland with activities such as scavenger hunts for lost treasure, map making, boat building and more. Pixie dust is a must!

New! Game Architects (entering grades 3 – 6)*

In this camp, creative freedom roams as you are tasked to create new and exciting camp and board games! From design, to creation, to implementation, campers will experience all stages of game design and be able to teach them to their fellow campers.

Dance and Cheer (entering grades 1 – 8)*

Campers will learn the fundamentals and basic techniques of dance routines and cheerleading, while gaining confidence and making new friends! Campers will showcase what they learn at our Thursday night Dance and Music show. Families are encouraged to attend.

Magic Camp (entering grades 3 – 8)*

The Hamilton Area YMCA Sawmill Branch has joined with professional magicians to offer campers the opportunity to learn magic in a fun setting. Your camper will learn how to perform an assortment of magic tricks and illusions.

The purchase of a \$35 magic kit is required.

Campers enrolling in more than one week only need to purchase one kit.

Aqua Mania (entering grades 4 – 8)*

Campers will learn the fundamentals of swimming and water safety. There will be instruction in all four main strokes: freestyle, backstroke, breaststroke, and butterfly. Pool games will be played as well, including water polo and pool basketball! In addition to pool fun campers will participate in traditional camp activities each afternoon.

Camper Survivor (entering grades 3 – 8)*

Campers will put to the challenge in this camp. Going on scavenger hunts, teaming up to build the best shelter, and engaging in challenging trials. Who will be the next survivor?

New! Capes and Crusaders (entering grades 1 – 5)*

Bring your courage, because you're the caped camp hero! Campers will create their own super identities, masks and capes as they prepare to defend Sawmill in a series of games from its biggest villain "The Not Y Guy".

ENRICHMENT CAMP

Exploration Art (entering grades 1 – 3)*

Let your inner artist shine! Campers will use a variety of creative techniques to create daily masterpieces and memories.

New! Camp Rock! (Entering grades 1 – 5)*

Campers will make music using their voices, simple instruments, and even everyday household items. Campers will share all they have learned at our Thursday night Dance and Music show! Families are encouraged to attend.

Bugs, Dinosaurs and the Zoo! (Entering grades 1 – 3)*

Campers will enter the world of bugs, dinosaurs and popular zoo animals, as they participate in many fun themed activities. Campers will learn the different types of dinosaurs, bugs and animals, dig for dinosaur bones, search for bugs, create their own zoo animal, and more.

Artful Minds (entering grades 4 – 8)*

Discover your inner Picasso or da Vinci! We'll use everyday items and turn them into pieces of art. Each child will have the opportunity to bring home their own masterpiece.

Storyteller Tales (entering grades 1 – 5)*

Stories, comics, poems, and creative writing! This camp is geared toward the creative child, who will be challenged with developing a story and then bringing it to life for the whole camp to experience.

EDGE (Educate, Develop, Give, Experience) (entering grades 6 – 9)

Campers will learn about responsibility, cooperation, teamwork, leadership, goal setting, problem solving, conflict resolution and the rewards of giving to others. EDGE campers will leave with a sense of accomplishment and self-esteem that will follow them through school, work and beyond. Campers will also participate in supervised volunteer activities at local not-for-profit organizations.

LIT – Leaders In Training (entering grades 7 – 8) (must complete leadership camp application)

The Leader in Training program is for campers looking to develop and enhance their leadership skills. LITs will participate in group discussions, problem solving games and other teen oriented activities. They will also have opportunities to practice these learned skills by taking on a leadership role in camp by helping with weekly events and activities.

CIT – Counselors In Training (ages 14 – 15) (must complete leadership camp application)

Our Counselor in Training program gives teens ages 14 and 15 a place to learn about teamwork, communication, understanding and responsibility in an outdoor environment. CITs will learn to become leaders within their peer group by building confidence, trust and respect. CITs will have the opportunity to apply their training by taking a leadership role in our day camp, developing creative programs and working with younger campers. This camp provides a great opportunity to gain self-confidence, improve leadership skills, learn how to work with children of all ages and have fun at the same time! This camp runs in three week sessions.

SKOR CAMP

This camp is specially designed for children ages 5 – 21 with intellectual disabilities. SKOR (Special Kids Organized Recreation) offers a 5:1 camper to staff ratio and a full range of activities and experiences including a variety of sports, swimming and crafts. Campers must be partially toilet trained, must have some way of communicating their needs, and must be free of uncontrollable aggressive behaviors. SKOR Camp transportation is available at the Steinert bus stop only. A pre-camp interview is required for all new campers registering for SKOR camp. MAD SCIENCE

Try our exciting science-based enrichment camp for children in grades 1 – 5. Campers will enjoy 3 hours of fun, hands-on science programs each camp day. Professionally trained Mad Science staff will spark the imagination and curiosity of all campers. Campers in Mad Science camp will participate in traditional camp activities, including recreational swimming, for the remainder of the camp day.

Launching with Legends

6/26 – 6/30

Anyone can be an inventor! Discover the work of da Vinci, Edison, Tesla, and Benjamin Franklin and use what you learn to invent solutions to everyday problems, prepare patent proposals, receive a patent certificate, build your own catapult, and even launch projectiles off a large trebuchet! Budding inventors bring home a model catapult, a mysterious spinning stick, a helicopter, and countless other cool inventions.

Super Slimy Smokey Science

7/17 – 7/21

Junior Scientists will dive into a variety of scientific fields as they mix and stretch silly putty and slime, copperplate nickels, and investigate the mysteries of optical illusions. Laser experiments and dry ice demonstrations will capture their attention as they observe how fun and exciting science can be. Campers will be amazed as they observe a chemical energy display, the world's simplest motor, and a hair-raising interactive demonstration worthy of praise by Van de Graaff himself! Through hands-on experiments ranging from circuits to catapults, children will be able to experience the fascination of what happens when you mix science and fun!

Junior Physicians' Academy!

8/7 – 8/11

In this week-long camp, children will have hands-on fun as they learn about scientific equipment that is near and dear to them- the human body! Campers will explore the science behind cells, organs, muscles, and bones as they navigate through the systems that make up our astonishing anatomy. Children will construct model cells, make "Mad Mucus", build stethoscopes and lung models, and work together to assemble a model skeleton for a entertaining and educational week of camp!

Brixology 101

8/21 – 8/25

Brixology Camp sets the foundation for our next generation of makers! Children learn about different types of engineering and then team up to construct a different engineering-themed project using EXCLUSIVE MAD SCIENCE BUILDS by LEGO® bricks! From carnival rides to drawing machines, mechanical animals to truss bridges, your future engineer will build upon their creativity!

SPORTS CAMPS

Campers in our sports camps will learn fundamentals, drills, rules and etiquette in various sports. Sports camps will focus on the developing and improving specific sport skills and techniques while learning the value of fair play and sportsmanship. At the YMCA, we use sports to teach lifelong skills and values.

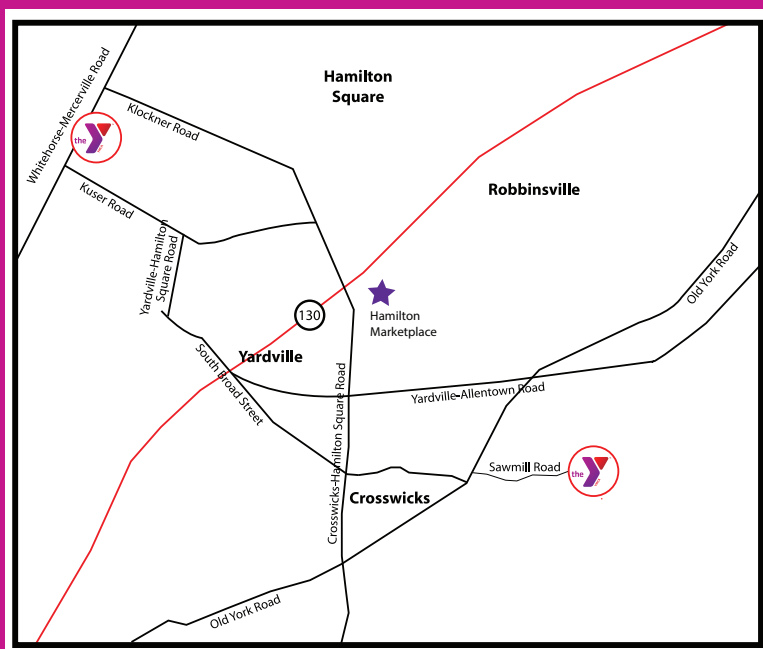
